This Grade II* listed building in Manchester was once the home of Elizabeth Gaskell, author of the famous novels Cranford, North and South and Wives and Daughters. The Manchester Historic Buildings Trust acquired the property in 2004 and in 2012 was given a Heritage Lottery Fund grant to bring the house to life and restore and furnish it to the period when the Gaskells lived there. The Trust's vision is to 'ensure the house gives pleasure, inspiration and a place to learn for today's visitors' and one of the first things that visitors will see as they approach is the LeesonBound pathways that surround the elegant Regency-style villa and gardens. The resin bound adds style and blends beautifully, enriching the transformation of a rundown house to a welcoming family home.
